Using **Alphablocks** phonics word cards to build words.

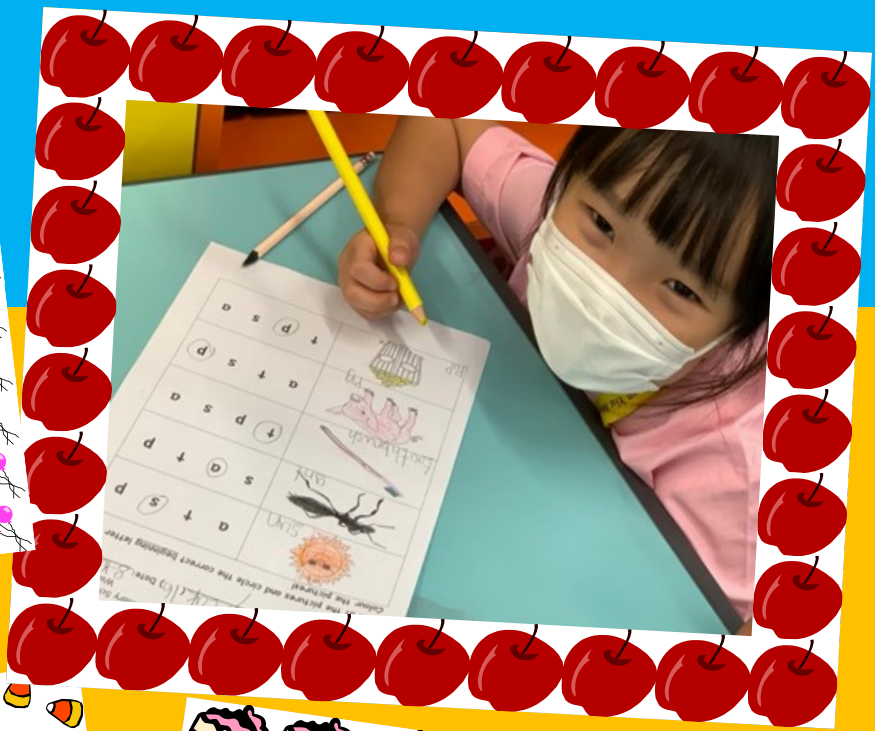


On your marks, get set, **GO!**

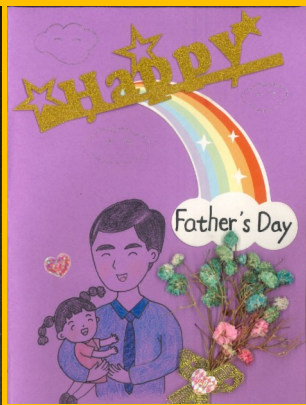

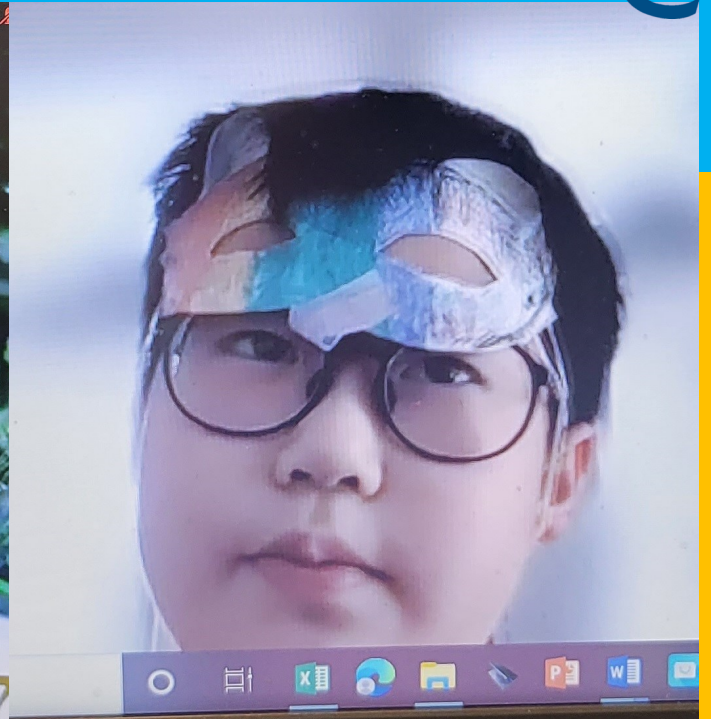

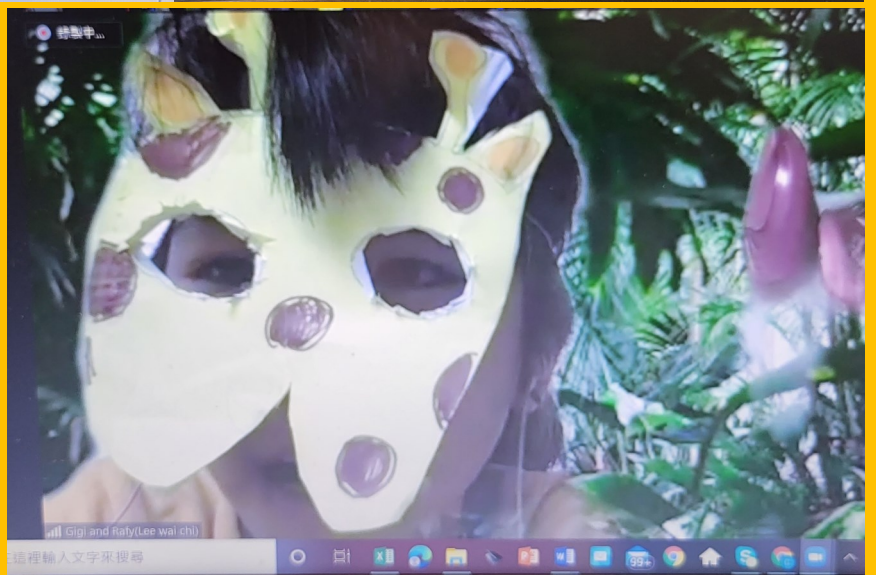
Drama Festival

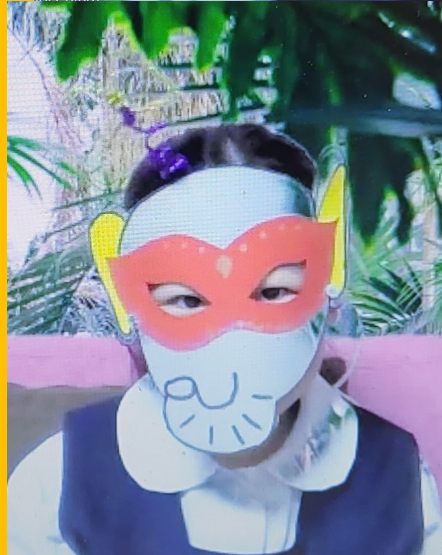


The whole group got the award for **"Outstanding Cooperation"**.

50 students from P.1 to P.3 had the opportunity to join the Japan and Australia Virtual Tours run by the English Wise Learning Centre on 27th July, 2022.

Students were very excited and fully involved in the tours. Both tours widened their horizons in learning English as well as in exploring the outside world.

During the tours, students interacted with the Native English teacher and read and answered information and questions in English confidently.



The online tour started at 9:00 a.m. Students followed the itinerary, and virtually toured various attractions including religious and historical landmarks in Singapore.



The tour was followed by an online (Zoom) STEM Workshop. The **Flight Simulator Workshop** was designed to encourage interest in aviation.

Students were given booklets to record the day's activities. They had to write about two things they found unforgettable in the online tour. They also had to write a short reflection of the tour. All students felt that the tour was educational, informative, and interesting.

A Letter to Santa Claus



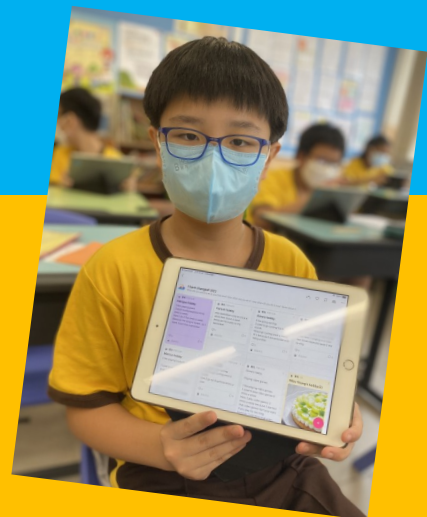
In celebration of the Christmas festivities, all students in primary 1 – 6 eagerly wrote letters with all their wishes for presents to Santa Claus!

e-Learning

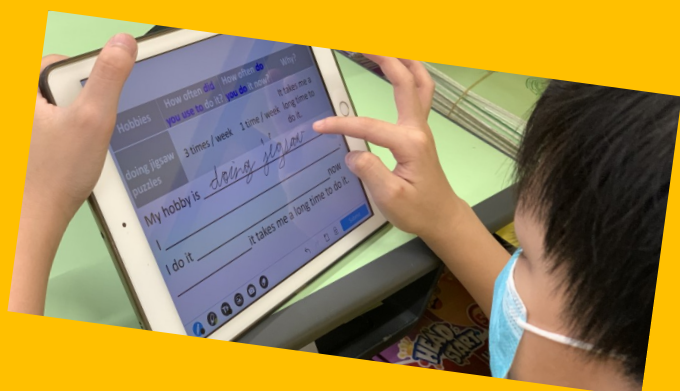

P.2 students used iPads to design cookies. They wrote sentences about their designs and used Wordwall for vocabulary building and sentence making throughout the activity, e.g. crosswords, picture-word matching, etc.

P.4 & P.6 students used Nearpod to do reading and grammar activities.

P.5 students used Padlet to write about past hobbies, which were later viewed as a class on whiteboards.

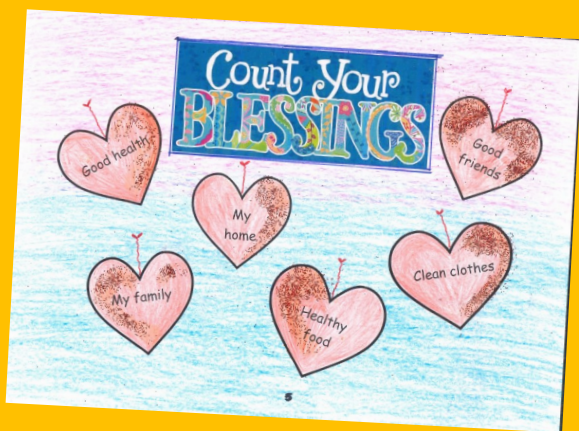
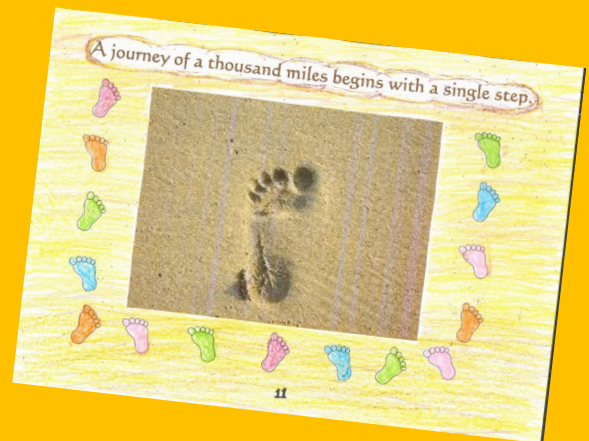
